XTS is not it.



XTS is not it

- Artistic license
- Crufty code
- Needs auditing for false positives (and negatives)
- Written in a not-quite-C language that needs to be converted to C first
- No real automated log parsing
- But: over 1000 test cases!



Needed: combined tests for server and driver



Needed: combined tests for server and driver

- Writing test cases must be simple
 - Writing test cases **should be required**
- Parsing output logs must be simple
- Executing tests must be reliable and predictable

googletest

- C++ framework
- Provides ASSERT_* macros
- Provides several ways to execute test (with/without parameters, etc)
- Text/xml-based logging
 - Integration with e.g. Jenkins
